Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

People – women and men – who are trying to cope with the incessant demands of both raising a family and earning an income can be mightily offended by the story of Martha and Mary. Being under relentless siege day after day makes quiet contemplative time seem like a fantasy, even a selfish indulgence. Perhaps we could say that Catch 22 is in operation also. To approach a gospel story like this with an open mind, receptive to the wisdom it might offer, takes time! Yet, to be caught up in a never-ending cycle of activity, allowing ourselves to be stressed to the limit, is asking for trouble. Never to step back and reflect on what we're investing all our energy in and why condemns us to a perpetual treadmill. Are we allowing ourselves to be driven by status/envy? Are we allowing ourselves to be entertained to death? More and more people are writing about the changes they've had to make in their lives because of loss or aging or life-threatening illness. So many of them are saying they had their priorities wrong. They didn't take time to relish the blessings that money can't buy. They weren't wise enough to cherish love and friendship. They had so many

experiences but missed the meaning. Will we? $\space{-1mu}$

Scriptural Context: It is no accident that this story about Martha and Mary immediately follows the parable of the Good Samaritan. We must remember that Jesus is portrayed as telling that parable as clarification of the law to love God and love neighbour. The Samaritan provides an example of what it means to love one's neighbour whilst in this story, Mary provides an example of what it means to love God. Together, the two stories tell us that compassionate service to one's neighbour is crucial but that God does not require service, simply love.
