Words From the Desk of our PP...

<u>Jubilee Year: "Hope does not disappoint" – Being Pilgrims of Hope:</u>



I have been slow to say anything about the Jubilee Year: Pilgrims of Hope – In part I have been thinking and in part I have been waiting for the Liturgy and Parish Council groups to meet to discuss our plans.

Pilgrims of Hope: that means you and I. We live in Hope: the hope that is Christ Jesus our Lord. We move through the world as pilgrims who bring that Hope to the world – to our world. Pope Francis speaks of our times being times with a lot of apprehension, anxiety, hesitation, doubt, discouragement, pessimism and cynicism. He has called this Jubilee Year as a counter to those negatives with the solution being found in Christ Jesus.

With the Parish Pastoral Council and the Liturgy Group we are seeking to bring this truth of being Pilgrims of Hope as a threat enriching everything we do so that it informs and enlivens all the things we seek to implement as disciples of Christ to the world around us.

Alpha:

We are still getting requests for Alpha: we have closed the list for the current offering but please be patient and participate in the August offering. Thank you for your enthusiasm.

#### Parish Finance Council:

The Parish Finance Council met this week and discussed elements of the budget for 2025, plans to develop the possibility of building a Columbarium (a wall with niches in which to inter cremated remains of parishioners) and possibilities for re-configuring the sanctuary to provide an improved Mass experience. We also discussed the Thanksgiving campaign from October 2024 and how successful it has been for both support of the church operations and of the parish priest. It is early days to see a full trend, but your generosity is amazing. Thank you. A thank you letter is on its way to all parishioners. WE hope to be able to provide quarterly updates to all givers.

#### Parish Pastoral Council:

Our first Parish Pastoral Council meeting was held on the past Thursday with a near full complement of members – thank you to all of you for making the time to be there. The Parish Pastoral Council discussed the various reports about pastoral and business aspects of the parish and its life. Possibilities for a Columbarium and for modifying the Sanctuary were discussed and approval given to proceed to get detailed plans for both. Once these are available, we will present the ideas to the parish.

#### Liturgy:

Melbourne Octet: Please pencil in 21<sup>st</sup> March 7 pm at St Gregory the Great Church for about an hour. This is a special date: a date on which the Melbourne Octet (eight professional singers) will come and share a Lenten Evening with us. An evening of song, prayer and reflection. An evening to draw us into the Hope that is Jesus Christ. An evening in the middle of Lent that we pray will provide us with a unique moment of grace to guide us towards Holy Week and the Resurrection. There will be other moments of grace as the year progresses so please, when you hear the details book in and come along.





In between, Paul takes the people of Corinth and us into the heart of the paschal mystery of Jesus' death and resurrection. This reality was experienced by Cephas, the apostles and a large group of the first disciples. It is the mystery by which we too die to sin and rise to new life with Christ.			



#### Fr Anton Aseervathampillai: New Assistant Priest:

On 15<sup>th</sup> February we will welcome a new Assistant Priest for St Greg's and St Kevin's. Here below follows a brief biography in his own words:

"My name is Fr. Anton Punithakumar Aseervathampillai, but I go by Fr Anton. I was born on 4<sup>th</sup> September 1973 in Mullaitivu, the northern part of Sri Lanka. After having completed my Philosophy and Theology at St Francis Xavier's Major Seminary, Jaffna, Sri Lanka, I was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Jaffna on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2005.

I served for 3 years as an assistant priest before serving as a parish priest for 12 years in three different parishes. I came to Melbourne on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2020 as a chaplain to the Tamil speaking people from Sri Lanka, India, Malaysia and Singapore who live in the Archdiocese of Melbourne. I served for 5 years as a part-time assistant priest of St Andrew's Parish, Werribee. Serving in Doncaster & Templestowe will be my second appointment as a part-time assistant priest in the Archdiocese of Melbourne. I am so thrilled to be with you serving in ministry. As I begin my ministry with you, could I kindly request your continuous support and prayers to be a good and worthy servant of God."
