Words From the Desk of our PP...

St Charles Borromeo School:

It is with great sadness, and a real measure of grief, that I am letting you know that St Charles Borromeo School has begun the process of closing. My two sons attended the school from 1984, just a year after it opened: different times; different needs.

You will be aware that our school has been experiencing declining enrolments for some years. Due to a complex range of factors, the enrolments at the school have now dropped to five students. At this level the school is unsustainable and must close: a necessity from both practical reasons and government funding perspectives.

A process is underway to support families to seek alternative schools for the remaining students and another process is in place to support staff as they seek to move to new roles, in other schools.

St Charles Borromeo Catholic Primary School has made a significant contribution to our parish community, and I pay tribute to Fr Charlie McCann Parish Priest and Sister Pauline (first principal) for their vision in creating the school. I give thanks also to the successive Principals over the years and to subsequent Parish Priests.

There will be a lot more to be decided and worked through as the closure of St Charles proceeds.

In the meantime, I extend my heartfelt gratitude to all those who have been a part of the school community in recent times, and please, as a parish community, keep the remaining St Charles families and their children and the staff in your prayers.

<u>Jubilee Year: "Hope does not disappoint" – Being Pilgrims of Hope:</u>

I spent 45 minutes with the children at St Charles Borromeo – a Q&A session. And all the discussion was about things to do with the Jubilee Year. It is always intriguing to hear questions asked in complete innocence: questions simply about why we have jubilees, and what hope is and what the difference is between hope and Hope. Charming, instructive.

Hot Water Heaters:

We have been taking advantage of a government changeover system to provide new heat-pumps for free: one at St Greg's, two at St Kevin's. So you will see a new piece of equipment outside, like the one in the photo.







REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading

Jeremiah 17: 5-8 A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

A curse on those who trust in humanity; a blessing on those who trust in the Lord.

The 'curse' and 'blessing' from this text of Jeremiah correspond to the beatitudes and woes of Luke's gospel. The contrast is between the person who puts trust in human beings as against the one who places trust in the Lord. It is strongly drawn. Each is presented with striking nature imagery which will help to depict the message for the listeners.

This passage and Psalm 1 which is used for today's response share the same material - the content and the imagery is the same. It is unclear which one is borrowing from the other. Inclusive language is difficult here. The NRSV puts it into the plural; although this may not be the best solution, it is, at least, a translation which is available.

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 15: 12, 16-20

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians If Christ is not raised from the dead, your faith is in vain. In these weeks before Lent, the second reading is taken from the fifteenth chapter of 1 Corinthians. It is devoted to the resurrection. Those who proclaim these texts should read the whole of 1 Cor 15 to put the selections into context.

It seems that some of the community in Corinth were questioning the possibility of our resurrection after death because they tended to discount the body and focus only on the spirit. Paul's argument goes back and forth: Christ is raised, so all are raised. If all are not raised, Christ is not raised... but in fact, Christ has been raised and this is our hope.

The Paschal Mystery is about transformation from death to life – for Christ and for all of us who are joined to Christ. If we only see what happens in this life, we see only the dying and not the emergence of new life. If death is the end, we perish. But Paul is teaching hope. Christ lives and will lead those who follow him to life.

Some recent past 2nd Collections, and the next

St Kevin's Parish 2nd Collection contributions from late last year include: The 'Archbishop's Campaign', which over 3 weekends of August 2024 raised \$2,539 (\$811,178 from across the whole Archdiocese) to support: Corpus Christi College; Priests Retirement Foundation; University of Divinity; John Pierce Centre (impaired hearing) and the Archbishop's Evangelisation project. Over 3 weekends in September 2024 we contributed \$1,304 to NAPCAN (National Association for Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect. To Mackllop Family service over 2 weekends last November we collected \$1,422.70. To Caritas Australia Lebanon Crisis Appeal (November 2024) \$845.35. To the Brigidine Asylum Centre \$722.75; The Annual Christmas period 2nd Collections for Loyo (St Kevin's P.S.) & Mantayupan (St Charles P.S.) Elementary Schools in the Philippines raised \$2,243.90. Each of these donations from our Parish has been individually acknowledged and warmly appreciated. For the next 3 weekends 2nd Collections will support Opening the Doors Foundation (Keeping Koori kids in an education of their choice). - John Costa, SJA
