


BOOKISH MORNING TEA

REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT				
First Reading	Second Reading			
Isaiah 43:16-21	Philippians 3:8-14			
A reading from the prophet Isaiah	A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians			
I am doing a new thing and I will give drink to my people.	Because of Christ I look upon everything else as useless in order to gain him.			
Memory and hope are constantly interwoven in the scriptures and in the liturgy. This poetic reading is about new beginnings, in the past and still to come. Isaiah's prophetic words of hope are delivered to the exiles languishing in Babylon. First is an invitation to remember the new beginning of the Exodus – crossing the Red Sea marks the end of oppression and a new future in a new land. Then comes the climax of the poem, the central declaration: <i>See, I am doing a new deed, even now it comes to light; can you not see it?</i> In the second half of the reading, there is the promise of new beginnings to come – <i>paths in the wilds,</i> wild beasts tamed, <i>water in the wilderness.</i> And the people of God will sing praise! It calls forth in the assembly a sentiment of wonder at the greatness of God's 'new deed', forever taking place in our midst.	Before starting to prepare this text, recall the story of Paul's conversion. He was zealously persecuting Christians when, in a blinding light, he encounters Christ. Here in this text he is talking about what meeting and getting to know Christ has meant for him. He invites his hearers also to an encounter with Christ. Paul realises that it is not what he can do that matters, only what Christ can do in and through him. He has been captured by Christ. He strives with the determination of an athlete to take and use the gift he has been given. It means making the pattern of Jesus' death and resurrection operative in his own life, so that he will be given a place in the glory of the resurrection. Paul is manifestly passionate about his encounter with Christ in order to communicate to the assembly the power which lies in our own encounter with Christ.

Lenten Reflection - Behind the scenes of CDF and Catholic Social Services is a call to action (the following includes brief extracts from *Catholic Social Services Victoria's 2025 Mission Inspired Leadership Programme* and the ACBC Social Justice Statement 2024-2025).

The CDF Speaker at our Parish Masses last weekend wasn't exaggerating when explaining that the successful investment funds managed by the Catholic Development Fund support very many more Catholic Services ("Catholic Social Care Ecosystem") than he quickly mentioned. These are based on principles fundamental to our faith, *that are actually our values in action*, also including training. It's noteworthy that the Catholic Church is the largest non-government provider of social and education services in Australia. Prompted by values and advocacy from Catholic Social Services Victoria, Australian Bishops, and our own observations, selected Parishes, including St Kevin's currently limited participation, endeavour to engage in or support selected social community initiatives, advocacy *and actions*. This is the *"bringing God to people"* part of our faith. Our Parish Website Social Justice Action page illustrates this, and links to resources including the Australian Catholic Bishop's Conference (ACBC) Social Justice Statement. Their 2024-2025 Social Justice Statements Summary includes the description "Truth and Peace: A Gospel Word in a Violent World - a call to action for Catholics and all people of goodwill to engage in peacebuilding through truth-telling, dialogue, and practical initiatives. It frames peace as a realistic and attainable goal, grounded in the teachings of the Gospel and example of Christ. By addressing *both global and local conflicts*, the statement encourages collective effort towards a peaceful world, rooted in the values espoused by our faith. These are designed to be universal, applied by people of various faiths or none. Are we interested in considering manageable action?

When people of our Parish donate or contribute directly they don't seek thanks. However it's important to let them know how their contributions have helped, and to warmly say "thank you".
